

Announcing...the Greater Wichita Area Schooling Show Championships!
October 15th, 2011 hosted by Kansas Dressage and Eventing Association in 2011
and hosted by Briar Fox Farm in 2012

Dressage Championship Divisions: Introductory through FEI Levels, with divisions for both Juniors (those turning 18 or younger in qualifying yr) and Adults. Also Quadrille, PasdeDeux and Freestyle.

To Qualify: 2 scores from any test at the level, from 2 judges in 2 different schooling shows in the Wichita area.

Intro/Training/First: 61% or more Juniors and 62% for Adults

Second and Above, Quadrille, PasdeDeux and Freestyle: 60% or better

Eventing Championship Divisions: Starter through Preliminary

To Qualify: 2 scores of 39 Penalty Points (both Junior and Adult) from 2 different judges from 2 different schooling shows in Wichita area. See further specifications, below

Other specifications:

- **Qualifying Fee: Rider pays the normal schooling show class entry fee, but also fills out a special form identifying which test is a Qualifying ride. There is a \$5.00 fee to ride a test/class as “Qualifying.” The rider is placed/scored in the schooling show class, and if the appropriate score is received, the rider has earned one of their two qualifying rides.**
- Qualifying rides for Eventing championships include both schooling combined tests (dressage and stadium) and schooling horse trials (only dressage and stadium scores used to determine if qualifying score is met).
- Qualifying Shows: Qualifying rides can be earned at any KDEA or Briar Fox Farm show between January 1, 2011 and September 30th. For successive years, the qualifying season shall be 10/1/XX to 9/30/XX. \

Championship Show – Entry Information

- Rider must submit copy of front of Qualifying Tests with Championship Entry. Championship show management will make every attempt to properly identify those who are qualified, but it is ultimately the rider’s responsibility to provide evidence of having earned Qualifying scores.
- Championship Ride: The highest test of the level, ridden by the qualified horse/rider combination. Horse/Rider can qualify at two consecutive levels (i.e. Training and First) but only one qualified horse/rider combination can compete the day of the Championship show.
- Open show will be held along with the Championship show, so riders will be able to enter a “Warmup” test prior to their Championship ride. Every effort will be made to allow the rider to ride the warmup test prior to the Championship test.
- Scores earned in the open show portion of the championships will be eligible for Qualifying for the following year (assuming rider designates as Qualifying and pays fee).
- Judge for Championships: Minimum of an L-graduate who also has at least a USDF Silver Medal.
- Attire for Horse/Rider: We encourage those at the Championships to braid and wear ‘formal’ attire, but it is not required. Boots with heels, hardhat, and appropriate tack are required. Refer to United States Equestrian Federation rules or contact any KDEA Officer or Bonnie Griest.
- No whips or readers allowed in Championship classes; allowed in Qualifying rides.
- Awards: Awards ceremony will be held at the Championships, with photographs taken of both Champion and Reserve at each level. Ribbons awarded Ch/Reserve, and special prizes for Champion.
- Within 15 days of each schooling show, show secretary for schooling shows to submit qualifying fees, qualifying forms, and a copy of the final results to Sue Clarke, Schooling Show Championship coordinator.
